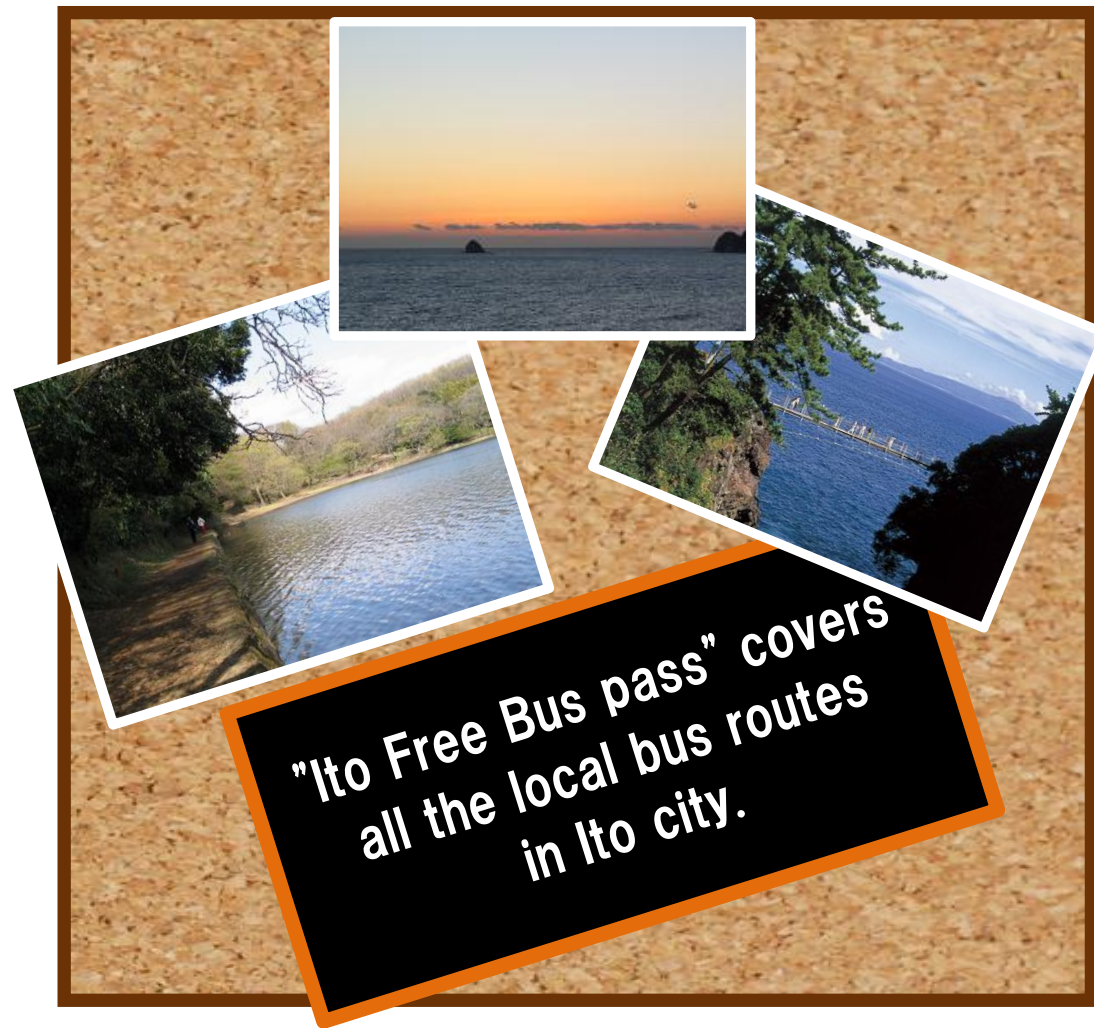


Travel around ITO city with TOKAI BUS Free Pass



Where to go in Ito?

Ito is one of the oldest hot spring resorts in Japan. The coastline along the pacific ocean and hilly landscape gives this area a diversity of scenery. The following spots are highly recommended.

Jogasaki Coast

The eruption of Mt.Omuro around 4,000 years ago discharged lots of lava to the seashore. Then long time erosion by waves has now formed these magnificent cliffs.

From "JOGASAKI GUCHI" to "IZU KAIYO KOEN", well maintained 3km long hiking trail is available.

Mt. Omuro(Omuro yama)

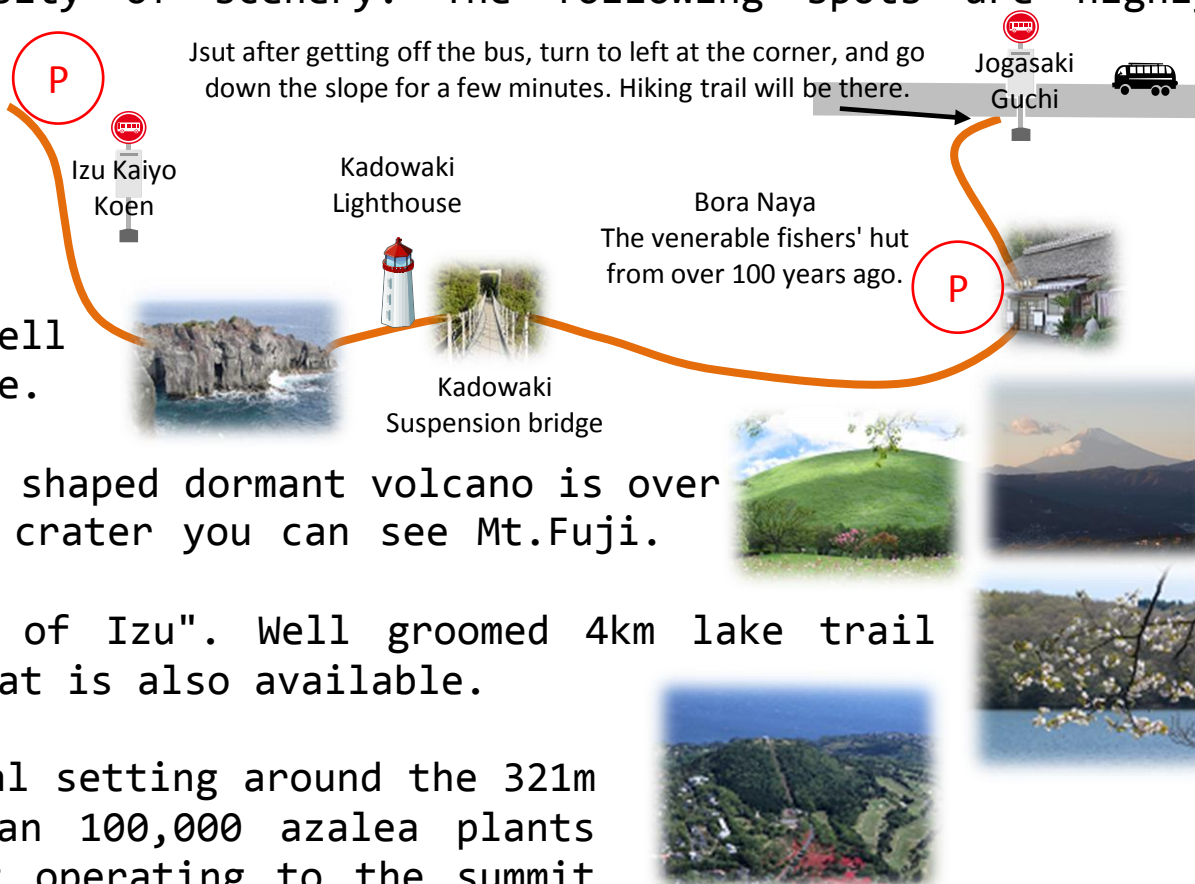
The crater of this 580 meters high rice-bowl shaped dormant volcano is over 300m in diameter. From the path around the crater you can see Mt.Fuji.

Lake Ippeki (Ippeki ko)

This is a natural lake called "the pupil of Izu". Well groomed 4km lake trail promises you a comfortable walk. A rental boat is also available.

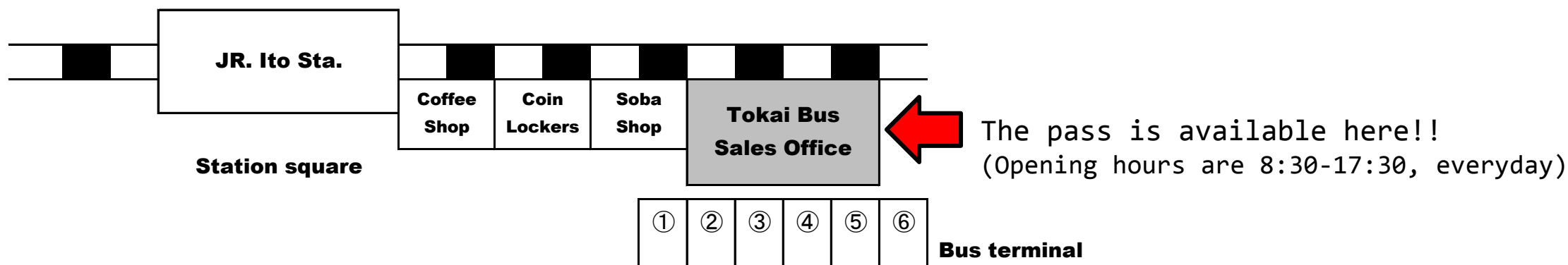
Mt. Komuro(Komuro yama)

A huge park spreads out utilizing its natural setting around the 321m high mountain. From April to May more than 100,000 azalea plants color the mountain. You can enjoy the lift operating to the summit and the breathtaking view of Mt.Fuji and the Izu islands floating on the Pacific ocean.



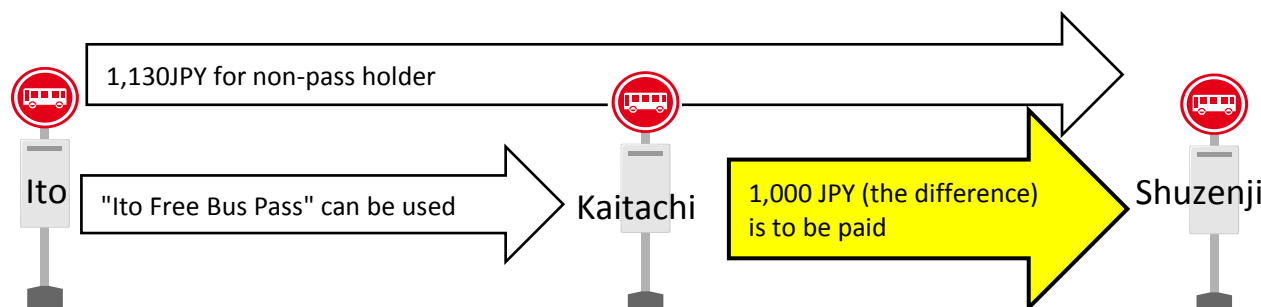
"Ito Free Bus Pass"

If you feel anxiety about getting on a local bus, the "Ito Free Bus Pass" becomes the solution. You can get on and off the local bus freely with this pass in Ito city for a reasonable fee (Adult 1,300 JPY, Child 650 JPY). This pass is valid on the day of issue only.



If you go to Shuzenji, you can use the pass as the illustration to the right mentions.

※ From Ito to Kaitachi busstop, the line is within Ito City (Valid area of the pass).

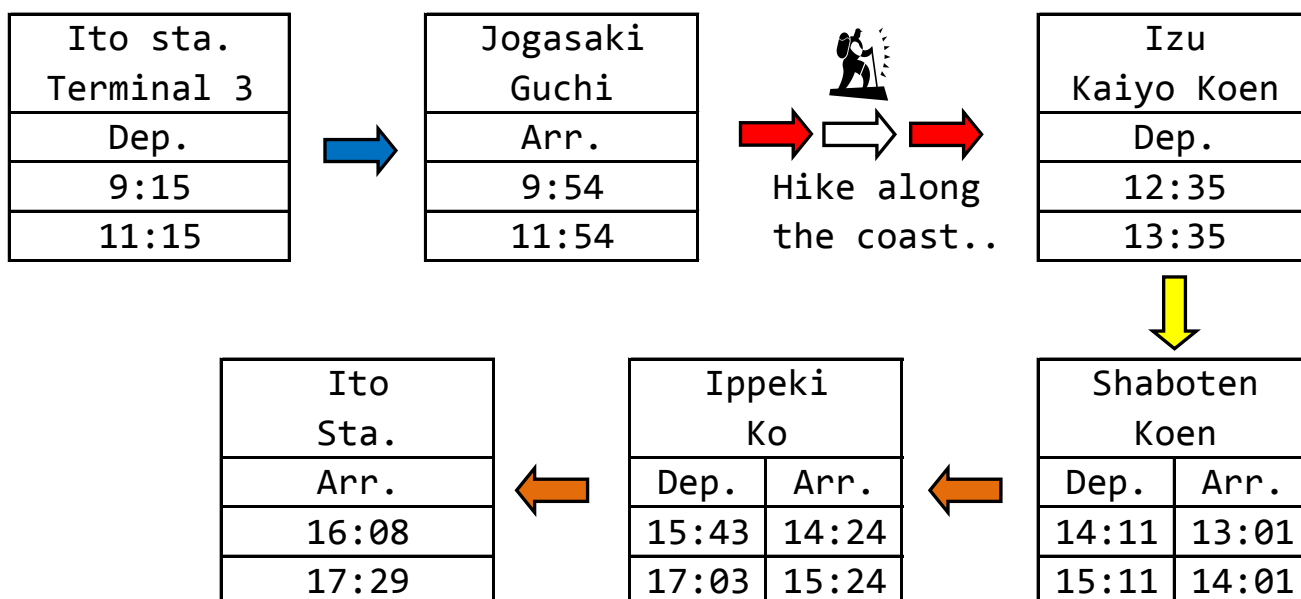

Recommended Itinerary



All of the routes are in the valid area of the "Ito Free Bus Pass", so you do not need to pay any additional bus fee.

Due to the limited operation between Ito. Sta and Mt. Komuro, this place is not mentioned in the above itinerary. If you want to stop in Mt.Komuro, you can get off the bus at "Ito Shogyo Koko (commercial high school)" busstop. All of the buses from "Ippeki Ko" to Ito Sta. go through this stop. It takes around 20 minutes from the stop to walk to the park around Mt. Komuro.

From Ito Sta.to Mt.Komuro (Komuro Yama Lift)

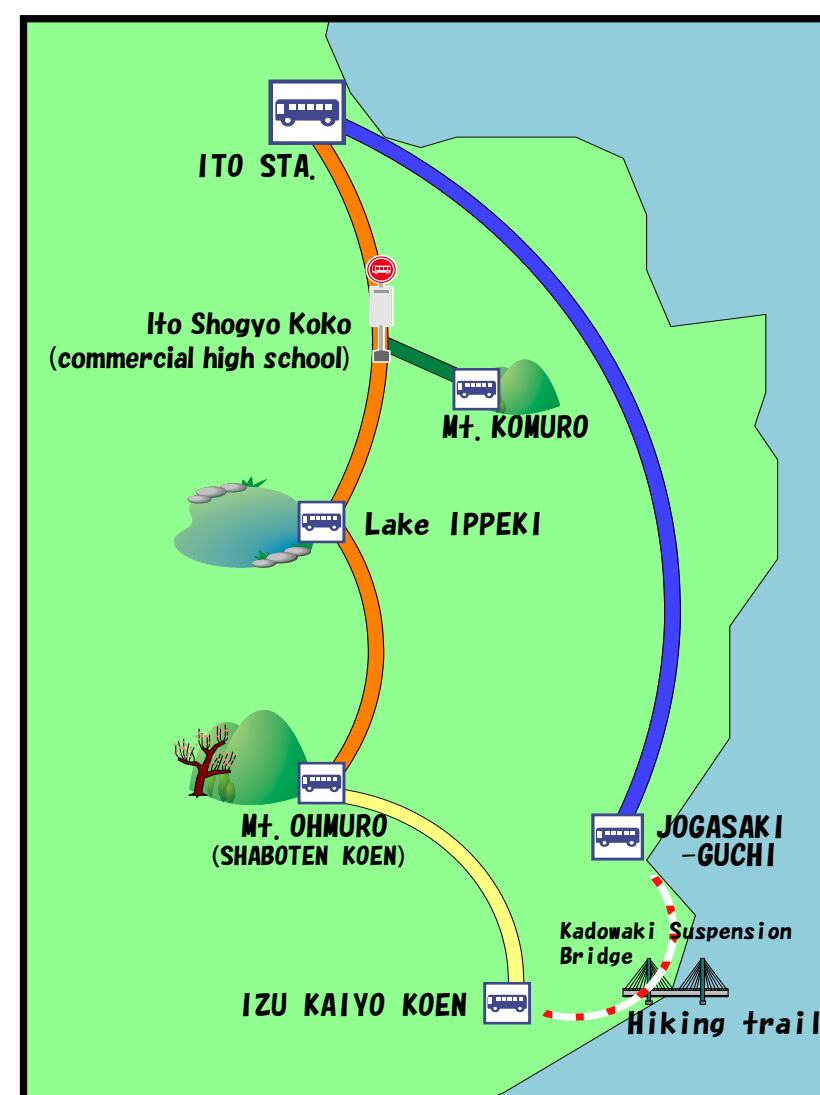

How to use "Tokai bus"(local lines)

Using local buses in Japan may be intimidating to foreign tourists but worth a try. To spend some time with local people in the same vehicle and exchange a few words may spice up your trip.



- Enter and exit the bus through the front door.
- Pick up a number-printed ticket from the vending machine next to the driver even if you board from the first stop or are a freepass holder.
- The fare of Tokai Bus is not flat. Check it on the display above the windshield.
- The coin changer does not accept high value banknote. To bring small change with you in advance is recommended.
- Press the button after the announcement of the stop to signal the driver that you wish to get off at the next.
- Drop the fee with number-printed ticket into the clear receptacle. If you have a freepass and the stop is in the valid area, please show the pass to the driver.
