Shuzenji (Shuzen-temple)

"Shuzen" means "master the way of Zen". This old temple was founded about 1,200 years ago by Kukai (Kobo Daishi), who established "Shingon" sect, one of Japan's major schools of Buddhism.

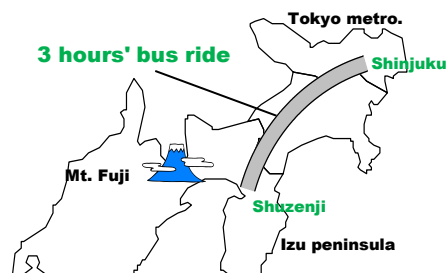
Around Shuzenji area

A quaint path connects temples, a cozy park, and bamboo forest along the river, in which one of the oldest hot spring (to be said that was found by Kukai himself) in Japan still lies.

Hot springs (Onsen)

Shuzenji is famous for luxurious Ryokans with hot springs. Some of Ryokans open their baths for non-staying visitors. You can feel an atmosphere of old Japanese style building at a moderate cost.

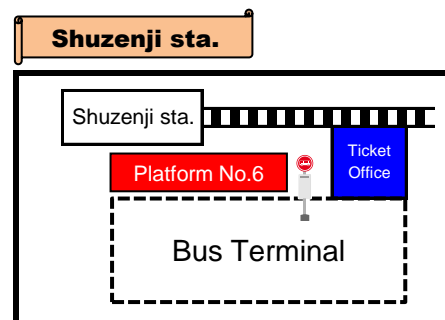
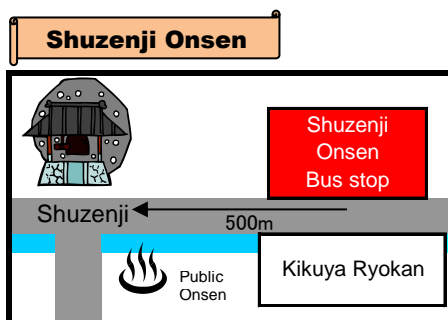
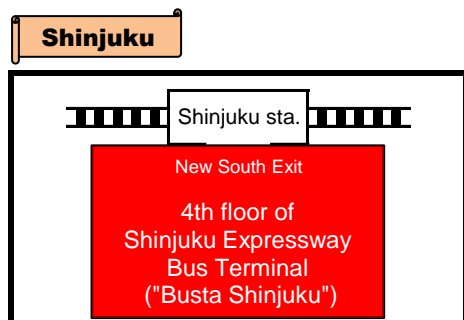

How to get the bus ticket

"Japan Bus Lines" (<http://japanbuslines.com/en>) offers English, Chinese and Korean online reservations. And "Japan Bus Online" (<https://japanbusonline.com/>) allows English only. Bookings can be made at any travel agency in Japan or our office above (blue colored).

(Please note reservations are not accepted in case you take this bus from/to Mishima station)
When unreserved seats remain, you can buy the ticket from the bus driver just prior to departure regardless of your destination.
