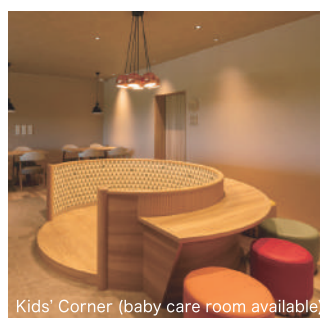

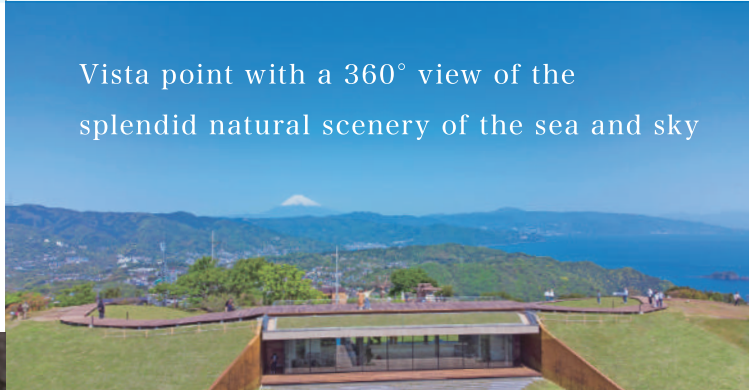

- 50km from Odawara (approx. 100min.)
- 28km from Atami City (approx. 50min.)

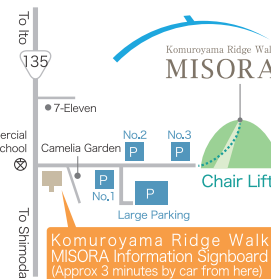
[From the Nagoya area]

- 50km from Numazu IC of Tomei Expressway (approx. 100min.)
- 50km from Nagaizumi Numazu IC of Shin-Tomei Expressway (approx. 100min.)

Komuroyama Park Free Parking Lots

No.1 Parking (79 cars), No.2 Parking (28 cars)
No.3 Parking (15 cars and 6 sightseeing buses);
Large Parking (156 cars)

*No. 1, 2 and 3 parking lots are often crowded, so we recommend using the Large Parking.
*Temporary parking lot (for a fee) will be available from mid-April to early May.

- Shizuoka Station-(36 min. by the JR Tokaido Shinkansen)-Atami Station

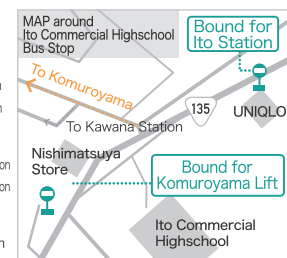
[From the Atami Station]

Komuro Shrine Okumiya (Summit)

It dates back to 1703, when Okubo Tadamasa, the feudal lord of Odawara, established a Shinto shrine as the western guardian of Odawara territory, which was devastated by a major earthquake in 1703. It is believed to protect people from earthquakes, maritime disasters, fire, and epidemics, and to watch over their recovery.

Komuro Shrine Satomiya (Foot of the Mountain)

In 1847, a stone torii gate was dedicated at the entrance of Komuro Shrine. It has been about 400 years since the construction of this torii gate, and despite enduring major earthquakes and disasters, it has escaped destruction, as if to demonstrate the virtue of Atago Gongen, the deity of the shrine. Satomiya was built in response to the faith in the Komuro Shrine Okumiya, a faith as strong today as ever.
